Description and Purpose of Report



The 2016-17 Elementary School Arts Profile summarizes arts instruction offered to students in grades K-5 during the 2016-17 academic school year at all 72 San Francisco Unified School District elementary and K-8 schools.

The report has two components: 1) a one page profile for each school that summarizes arts instruction offered to students during the curricular day (including information such as arts discipline, course content, provider, length of instruction and funding source) and 2) aggregated analyses that summarize arts instruction districtwide. School profiles are in Appendix A.

Information for this report was compiled from an annual arts summary each school site prepares for the Visual and Performing Arts
Department and SFUSD central office document. It does not contain information on arts instruction offered to students outside the curricular day. Future elementary school arts profiles will attempt to capture these additional resources. New information in this year's report includes arts instruction funded by school-site grants and/or received on an in-kind basis (see table to the right).

This report has been prepared to provide both school and district level information to a variety of stakeholders. The information included in this report can assist:

- Parents and caregivers to know the type and frequency of arts offerings available at individual schools at each grade level
- Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) and school site budget teams in using the information to identify gaps and to plan a more robust arts program for the coming year and beyond
- · The Visual Arts Department in decision making
- The refresh of the SFUSD Arts Education Master Plan

- District leaders as they create the SFUSD Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)
- Arts providers and funders in their support to schools in creating rich and varied arts programming

This project is the result of a ongoing collaboration between the Public Education Enrichment (PEEF) Office and the Visual and Performing Arts Department.

Information on arts discipline, course content, provider, length of instruction and funding source is provided for each instance of art instruction offered during the curricular day.

Information Collected For All Arts Instruction	Description
Activity	Name of the arts class offered: examples include General Music, Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Ceramics, Hip Hop, Musical Theater; information about specific classes offered to different grade levels within schools is presented wherever available
Arts Discipline	Arts discipline offered: one of four (music, visual art, dance, drama). In cases where art instruction crossed more than one discipline the one most associated with the activity was chosen.

Definitions

General Arts Teacher: Credentialed arts teachers hired and managed by the Visual and Performing Arts Department.

Instrumental Music Credentialed arts teachers hired and managed by Visual and Performing Arts Department and who teach as part of the Instrumental Music Teacher: Program, a program offered to fourth and fifth graders.

DCYF-IMP: The San Francisco Department of Children Youth and their Families (DCYF) provides funding for the district's Instrumental Music Program.

General Arts Program



All elementary schools are allocated at least one credentialed music, visual arts, dance or drama teacher from the General Arts Program two or three days a week based on student enrollment.

The General Arts Teacher Program was created to serve grades K-3 to create foundational knowledge in the arts. School sites may request that their assigned teacher serve grades K-5 depending on school need. School sites choose the arts discipline that best complements their arts vision and programmatic needs.

Music instruction may follow Orff, Dalcroze, Kodály methodology among others and includes world music, percussion, recorders, ukulele, vocal music and/or general music instruction.

Visual Art instruction includes drawing, painting, mixed media, ceramics, book arts, puppetry, integrated arts, individual and collaborative projects.

Dance begins with creative movement and culminates into choreographed dance training in diverse dance styles, including but not limited to world dance, tap dance, hip hop and modern dance.

Drama incorporates basic theatre training as well as musical theatre and performing arts classes that include dance and/or music.

The General Arts Teacher Program has been funded by the Public Education Enrichment Fund (PEEF) since 2008.

2016-17 Facts

- √ 31.0 full-time equivalent credentialed art teachers served at elementary schools as part of the General Arts Teacher Program.
- √ 99% of elementary schools were served by a General Arts
 Teacher.

Instrumental Music Program



The Instrumental Music Program serves fourth and fifth grade students. All elementary schools are allocated a credentialed instrumental music teacher to teach violin, flute, trumpet and clarinet once a week to participating students during the regular school day. Instrumental music teachers also teach instruments such as recorders or guitar to entire classrooms in additional to or in lieu of a pull-out program.

The Instrumental Music Program is offered to all fourth and fifth grade students and participation is optional. Instruments are available to all students and some families choose to rent or purchase their instruments.

In 2016-17 the Instrumental Music Program was funded by the Public Education Enrichment Fund and the City of San Francisco's Department of Children Youth and their Families.





2016-17 Facts

- ✓ 15.4 full-time equivalent instrumental music teachers served elementary schools.
- ✓ 100% of elementary schools were served by a credentialed instrumental music teacher.
- √ 4,551 fourth and fifth grade students participated in the
 Instrumental Music Program. These students comprised 53%
 of all fourth and fifth graders.

Artists-in-Residence



Schools leverage a variety of funding sources to hire community teaching artists/arts providers who offer instruction in various disciplines during the curricular day for multi-week residencies. Some community organizations also offer arts instruction on an inkind basis at no cost to school sites. For purposes of this report, all non-credentialed arts instructors/arts providers school sites engage with to offer arts instruction are considered "Artists-in-Residence".


While most Artists-in-Residences offer instruction in a single arts discipline, some organizations provide more than one artist across different disciplines.

Arts coordinators at each school site support the school's administration, faculty, and community in planning and coordinating a comprehensive arts curriculum that serves all students equitably.

2016-17 Facts

- ✓ All elementary schools engaged the services of at least one artist-in-residence
- ✓ Over one-third (36%) of schools engaged four or more artistsin-residence
- ✓ A total of 110 artists-in-residence served elementary schools.

Main Sources of Funding for Artists-in-Residence



School sites utilized a variety of funding sources to engage Artists-in-Residence. The main sources of funding are as follows:

Elementary Arts Program (EAP) The Elementary Arts Program is funded by the City of San Francisco's Department of Children Youth and their Families. This program distributes allocations to every school site to be used to hire community arts teachers/providers and pay for art materials and field trips; 90% of the allocation must be spent on instruction. In 2016-17 the per pupil allocation was \$21.37. The EAP allocation for an elementary school that served 350 students would have been \$7,478.

Public Education Enrichment Fund (PEEF) In March of 2004, San Francisco voters approved Prop H which established the Public Education Enrichment Fund. Ten years later Prop C, the "Our Children, Our Families" initiative was passed that provides funding for PEEF through 2040-41. PEEF support for the arts include the following: hiring certificated visual and performing arts teachers at all levels, maintaining Visual & Performing Arts Department administrative infrastructure, and providing professional development. PEEF also provides site allocations directly to schools that can be used for arts supplies/materials, field trips, artists-inresidence, teacher professional development in the arts, and/or credentialed arts specialists. In 2016-17 the elementary school site allocation was \$10 per student. For example, a school with 350 students would have been allocated \$3,500.

Additional arts instruction is funded by one or more of the following site-based sources: Parent Teacher Association (PTA), School Site Trust Funds, which consist of donations made to school sites by community members or organizations, or Discretionary Funds which are similar to school site trust funds.

2016-17 Facts

School sites used a variety of funding sources to support arts residencies.

- ✓ 99% used EAP funds
- ✓ 56% received arts residencies on an in-kind basis
- ✓ 51% used PEEF per pupil allocation funds
- √ 44% used PTA, school site trust funds, or discretionary funds
- √ 18% used other sources of funding (see following page)

School sites also received arts instruction from community arts providers and organizations on an **in-kind** basis. In 2016-17 40 schools received arts instruction by a community organization/artist-in-residence. The majority of these schools (32) were served by San Francisco Ballet's Dance in Schools and Communities Residency Program.

Other Sources of Funding for Artists-in-Residence



The following are additional funding sources used for Artists-in-Residence captured in this report.

Quality Teacher and Education Act (QTEA) Impact and Innovation Award The Quality Teacher & Education Act (QTEA) is a 2008 San Francisco voter approved parcel tax measure that supports the district's efforts to recruit and retain teachers.

Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Concentration Grant Under the new Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), a Concentration Fund is provided to schools with high concentrations of English Learners, low-income students and foster youth.

Targeted Instructional Improvement (TII) Supplemental funding to increase or improve services to underserved students and to provide access for all students to high- quality programs.

Targeted Carry Over Instructional Improvement (TIIBG)

Targeted Instructional Improvement Block Grant carry over.

Title 1 A federal program that provides supplementary funds to help improve instruction in high poverty schools to ensure all students meet state academic standards. All SFUSD Title I schools are school-wide programs and may use Title I funds for services and materials that supplement the school-wide educational program.

General Funds Funds allocated to school sites that may be used for any general purpose.

Funds Provided to School by Outside Organizations: these include Salesforce Principal Innovation Fund, San Francisco Foundation, San Francisco Arts Commission, California Partnership Community Art Academy, and other grants raised by schools.



Arts Disciplines Offered in 2016-17




The following pages contain analyses of all whole class arts instruction offered by teachers in the General Arts Program, the Instrumental Music Program, and Artists-in-Residence. The analyses do not contain the Instrumental Music Program, the majority of which serves students in pull-out classes.

The analysis of arts disciplines offered revealed that 88% schools offered music, 93% of schools offered visual art, 93% of schools offered dance and 67% offered drama to at least one grade level.

Details of Arts Disciplines Offered in 2016-17



The table below shows that all 72 schools offered two or more arts discipline, 86% offered three or more, while 54% offered all four. This analysis applies only to whole classroom instruction and does not include the fourth and fifth grade Instrumental Music Program.

A variety of factors can influence the number of arts disciplines offered at schools including the following: balancing multiple programs, site scheduling capacity, and space availability and suitability.

Music Instruction Offered in 2016-17




Eighty-eight percent of elementary schools offered additional music instruction to whole classrooms of students. These classes were taught by General Arts Teachers, Instrumental Music Teachers, and Artists-in-Residence. General Arts Teachers typically taught general music and/or vocal classes. Examples of classes taught to whole classrooms by Instrumental Music Teachers include recorder, drumming and guitar.








Instruction in the dramatic arts was offered by Drama teachers from the General Arts Program and Artists-in-Residence at 61% of elementary schools.

Summary of Findings



This report found the following:

- · arts instruction was offered in all 72 elementary schools
- 88% of schools offered whole class instruction in music, 93% offered visual art, 93% offered dance, and 67% offered drama
- 54% of schools offered all four arts disciplines
- 87% of schools offered three or four arts disciplines
- 4,551 students participated in the Instrumental Music Program and comprised 53% of all fourth and fifth graders
- All elementary schools were served by an Artist-in-Residence that supplemented district provided arts instruction
- 80% of schools were served by two or more Artists-in-Residence.
- 51% of schools received arts instruction from an Artist-in-Residence on an in-kind basis
