SAFELY REOPENING MUSEUMS IN LOS ANGELES

Proposal Based on Museum Sector Data

Submitted by a Consortium of Los Angeles Museums to the County and City of Los Angeles

January 21, 2021

LOS ANGELES MUSEUMS REOPENING

The County's major museums representing the diverse constituents of Los Angeles County are prepared to strictly adhere to the health and safety guidelines required by L.A. County and City for safe reopening of museums.

- Natural History Museum of Los Angeles
- California Science Center
- California African American Museum (CAAM)
- La Plaza de Cultura y Artes

We respectfully request that museums in Los Angeles County be permitted to reopen in the Purple Tier with:

- visitor capacity capped at 25%
- visitorship limited toLA County
- health and safety protocols and guidelines to ensure that we safely serve our communities

- Museums have implemented, and are ready to adhere to, new health and safety protocols and processes to provide a safe environment for visitors and staff.
- Phealth and safety protocols follow the guidelines provided by OSHA, Cal-OSHA, Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and the specific guidelines for museums provided by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health and L.A. City (included in Exhibit 1).
- Museums can be immediately responsive to any new directives put forth by the State, County and City.
- With a local focus, museums would open only to County residents while in the Purple Tier.
- Museums would not schedule any group activities, including special events, tours, lectures, classes, film screenings, performances, etc.
- Los Angeles museums will reopen in phases, based on readiness and guidance from State, County and City.

MUSEUMS THROUGHOUT THE U.S. HAVE SAFELY REOPENED

Beginning May 23, museums in major cities throughout the U.S. have reopened safely with limited visitor capacity, following health and safety guidelines in line with those provided for museums in L.A. County and City.

- Museums reporting high rate of compliance with health and safety protocols, including mask wearing and social distancing requirements
- No COVID outbreaks reported in museums, operating safely and successfully over months LA Museums can learn from peer museums across the US that have already reopened and are operating successfully

MUSEUMS ARE UNIQUELY POSITIONED TO SAFELY REOPEN IN LOS ANGELES

- Museums are well positioned and operationally able to meet standards required to **implement and provide conditions for safe visits.**
- Museums are un a unique position since they already have **highly trained and professional security and visitor services staff in place** whose jobs have always been to facilitate safe, touchless and orderly visitor flows and keep staff, visitors, and collection safe and secure.
- Museums offer generally a **touchless visit of galleries by nature** and have implemented new **touchless entry** with QR tickets scanned; any interactive exhibition components will be removed during the Purple Tier.
- Museums already have the **highest level of air filtration HVAC systems**, as required for the display of artworks and collection.
- Museums have large, carefully designed floor plans that naturally allow social distancing and have implemented one-way-traffic pathways for visitors.
- Museums' ticketing software provides the **ability to implement reduced capacity with advance online ticketing** (able to increase or decrease capacity/tickets sold) and can be responsive to changing conditions, even shutting down quickly if necessary.
- Museums have implemented mandatory online health screening for visitors and staff prior to entry, capture information for contact tracing during ticketing, and have onsite temperature checks
- Museums have implemented **higher frequency cleaning and disinfection** protocols
- Retail and restaurant operations within museums will strictly adhere to health and safety guidelines for those businesses.
- Museums provide places of quiet contemplation and offer a safe and supervised activity in the midst of the tensions of living in a state of emergency and isolation. Reopening LA's museums will help uplift and recharge the county's diverse communities.

Museum health and safety protocols have been used for <u>over six months</u> around the country and have proven to be effective.

MANAGING CAPACITY AND TOUCHLESS EXPERIENCE

Museums will employ the following protocols:

- Limit attendance and reduce public hours to manage capacity per square foot -- no more than 25% of stated building occupancy during Purple Tier
 - 25% of stated building occupancy during Purple Tier
 - 20% of stated building occupancy during Regional Stay At Home Order
- Only County visitors during Purple Tier
- "Touchless" advance, online timed-entry ticketing to regulate capacity and arrivals avoiding lines at museum entrance
- "Touchless" entry procedures
- Mandatory online health screening and temperature checks
- Ticketing system allows museums to capture visitor information for easy contact tracing









MANAGING CAPACITY AND VISITOR FLOW

- Professionally trained security officers and visitor services staff to control visitor flow and enforce strict adherence to health and safety protocols (including facemask wearing and physical distancing)
- Signage and floor markings to create a one-way path to enter, exit, and navigate the museum and ensure adherence to social distancing guidelines
- Discontinue group tours and activities, including classes, lectures, concerts, school visits, talks, films, etc. Theaters and auditoriums would remain closed to the public







MANAGING CAPACITY AND VISITOR FLOW continued









A SAFE, TOUCH-FREE VISITOR EXPERIENCE

Museums will employ the following protocols:

- Advance online health screening required, temperature checks, mask mandate for all visitors and staff
- Touchless entry procedure with QR code tickets and hand scanners
- Air flow is controlled by a superior air filtration system that includes MERV 14 air filters, which are replaced every three months
- No cash transactions



- Increased and frequent disinfecting and cleaning in all public and high-touch spaces
- Hand sanitizer stations positioned for use throughout museum spaces, along with reminders of frequent hand-washing

- Health and safety protocols enforced and signage provided throughout campus
- Visitors advised in advance (during online ticketing) of enhanced health and safety requirements
- Removal of printed materials throughout the museums, digital content and information provided
- Elimination of high-touch activities and shared resources, such as audio-guides
- Security and Visitor Services staff provided with training in health and safety protocols as well as all staff

MUSEUMS ARE A "STAY-LOCAL", SAFE RESOURCE

- Museums provide local residents with safe, enjoyable educational options and a supervised visit for "staying local"
- Museums require advance online ticketing, ensuring reduced capacity adherence
- Museums are uniquely able to enforce strict health and safety protocols to be followed by all visitors, unlike many other local activities
- Required compliance leads visitors in museums to model behavior that limits opportunities for transmission of the COVID-19 virus



SAFE AT WORK PRACTICES FOR EMPLOYEES

- Provide COVID-19 training and clear guidelines regarding new health and safety protocols in accordance with County Department of Public Health and City guidelines for museums
- All staff required to follow *Safe at Work Practices* posted in work spaces
- Staff required to wear masks and fill out daily health screening questionnaires
- PPE provided for staff who may require additional protection due to their job function
- Staff encouraged to work from home to reduce on-site occupancy and instructed to stay home if sick
- Institute work shifts and alternate work schedules for shared offices and open workstations to facilitate requirements for social distancing

- Use of shared equipment (copiers, printers, fridges, phones, hand tools) minimized and disinfecting supplies provided
- Breakrooms, lunchrooms, and social gathering spaces closed;
 breakrooms provided outdoors with social distancing
- All workspaces deep cleaned and sanitized before staff return to workspaces and hand sanitizers installed for every building entrance, exit and elevator lobby and provided to offices
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting of high-touch surfaces
- Increased cleaning protocols and frequency of cleaning for kitchens and restrooms, and daily disinfection of common areas
- Superior air filtration system and higher frequency of filter replacement
- All third-party contractors required to follow L.A. City and County public health and safety protocols
